

Natural Enemies of Crop Pests in Hawai'i



Ichneumonid Wasps

(parasitoids)

What to look for

Ichneumonids pupate inside their host, sometimes in distinctive striped or colored cocoons. The maggot-like larvae may be cream or greenish. Look for a single silken cocoon on or near a pest larva or pupa.

Appearance

Adults range from 1/8 inch to 5 inches long, including their stinger-like, egglaying ovipositor.

Their bodies are tan, brown, or black, and their wings may be shaded with blue and brown.

Host types attacked

larvae and pupa of moths, butterflies, beetles and flies

Crops protected

sweet corn cole crops

Pests attacked

Larvae and pupae of moths, beetles, flies and butterflies diamondback moth cutworms cabbage maggot

Ichneumonid Wasps

Ichneumonid wasps are attracted to the food source of their host pests, primarily vegetable crops, and to sources of available nectar, such as shallow, openfaced flowers, daisy-family flowers, and angelica.

Parasitoids

Parasitoids are insects that prey on other insects and thus can be of benefit to vegetable growers. Their eggs or larvae are usually found in or on a single insect host. The immature parasitoid develops within or on its host, ultimately killing the pest. Most parasitoids are wasps or flies.
